 Commissioner Morse made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on December 12, 2020. Commissioner Hedrington second the motion. Voice vote carried the motion.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

1. Discussion and/or Motion Items:

a. Commissioner Morse made a motion to approve Resolution 6196 approving and ratifying the emergency purchase of additional repairs to lift station #4 by McGilvra Electric pursuant to 2-491 of the City of South Beloit Code of Ordinances not to exceed \$9,668.26. Commissioner Adleman second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Discussion and/or Motion Items:

a. Attorney Goscik said there was an Ordinance passed in November regarding selling vacant lots owned by the City of South Beloit. Attorney Goscik said the vacant lots notice was published on December 3rd, 10th, and 17th. The final day to submit bids was today. Attorney Goscik announced the property address, bid amount (if any) and who submitted the bid. Attorney Goscik said Council would discuss the bids at a later date with staff and a recommendation would be made to determine if the bids would be accepted.

- b. From the Zoning Board of Appeals Meeting held on December 16, 2020 a positive recommendation was given regarding a Zoning Variance. Attorney Fitzgerald made a motion to approve Ordinance 2585 approving a Zoning Variance in the (R2) Residential Two-Family Zoning District for an accessory building (small shed addition to garage) from the required rear yard setback of 2.5 feet down to 1.4 feet for the property located at 731 Wheeler Avenue, South Beloit, Illinois, Winnebago County, with PIN No. 04-05-380-013. Commissioner Hedrington second the motion. Attorney Goscik said the owners are in litigation with the City for code violations for all 3 zoning items. The variances are a way to remedy the code violations. Attorney Goscik said if the variances are not approved, Attorney Kurlinkus will have to inform the judge that all 3 structures will have to be torn down. Commissioner Fitzgerald said the owners built what they wanted. Commissioner Fitzgerald said he is not happy with how they built structures without approval first. Mayor Rehl said this is necessary to clean up past issues. Commissioner Fitzgerald said he believes the City will eventually have to require structures that are built to be torn down. Attorney Goscik said the amounts of the variances are less than 5'. Mayor Rehl said Council needs to consider what the best interest is for the neighbors and the needs of the City. Commissioner Fitzgerald agreed that the owners have upgraded their property. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- c. From the Zoning Board of Appeals Meeting held on December 16, 2020 a positive recommendation was given regarding a Zoning Variance. Commissioner Morse made a motion to approve Ordinance <u>2586</u> approving a Zoning Variance in the (R2) Residential Two-Family Zoning District for an accessory building (small shed on side lot) from the required rear and side yard setback of 2.5 feet down to 1.7 feet for the property located at 731 Wheeler Avenue, South Beloit, Illinois, Winnebago County, with PIN No. 04-05-380-013. Commissioner Adleman second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- d. From the Zoning Board of Appeals Meeting held on December 16, 2020 a positive recommendation was given regarding a Zoning Variance. Commissioner Morse made a motion to approve Ordinance <u>2587</u> approving a Zoning Variance in the (R2) Residential Two-Family Zoning District for an accessory building (pavilion/canopy from the required rear yard setback of 2.5 feet down to 1.5 feet for the property located at 731 Wheeler Avenue, South Beloit, Illinois, Winnebago County, with PIN No. 04-05-380-013. Commissioner Adleman second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes. Mayor Rehl said the City will come out with a statement to residents in 2021 stating that any structures must go through the proper permitting process. Mayor Rehl said he will work with City Engineer, Seth Gronewold and Attorney Goscik. Commissioner Fitzgerald suggested a higher amount for fines. Attorney Goscik said the City currently has high fine amounts. Commissioner Fitzgerald said in the spring people will be building and he believes if there is no permit there should be a fine imposed or the structure will need to be torn down.
- e. Commissioner Fitzgerald made a motion to approve Resolution <u>6198</u> approving and ratifying the emergency purchase of additional repairs to Godwin Diesel Pump by Mid-State Equipment pursuant to 2-491 of the City of South Beloit Code of Ordinances not to exceed \$11,950.58. Commissioner Adleman second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- f. Commissioner Fitzgerald made a motion to approve Resolution <u>6199</u> approving Pay Application #2 regarding the City's ADA Improvements Project at City Hall in the amount of \$71,541.99. Commissioner Hedrington second the motion. Roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
- g. Council discussed recording/streaming and posting minutes of Council Meetings. Commissioner Adleman said he was approached by a citizen regarding both items. Commissioner Adleman would like to get bids to see what the cost for streaming the meetings would be. Attorney Goscik said there is nothing that prohibits the minutes of the meeting have to be approved by the Council prior to posting, however; the minutes need to be typed after the meeting, which takes time. The minutes, if posted prior to approval, would only be in draft form

and would need to be reposted if any changes were made to the minutes. Council discussed streaming needs that would need to include microphones for each Council member, as well as a high-tech projector, and possibly other items. Commissioner Adleman will look in to the cost and how other communities are handling streaming. Attorney Goscik said Poplar Grove invested in microphones, and a camera. They utilize Zoom with the public for their Council Meetings. They also have the ability to record the meetings. Commissioner Adleman will report back after research is done.
