Peter Gabriel, 2200 Riverside Drive, spoke to the council about the Dickop Street sign and how he would like to have the sign that was removed. City Attorney Livingston said he spoke with Mr. Gabriel's attorney and would like to layover this issue until the next City Council Meeting, May 17, 2010. Commissioner Griffin made the motion to layover. Commissioner Redieske second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

NEW BUSINESS:

Commissioner Clifton made the motion to authorize City Attorney Jeff Livingston to prepare an ordinance that would allow the Police Department to charge a fee for finger printing. Commissioner Griffin second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

Ms. Carol Dazey spoke to the City Council regarding purchasing a business located at 1019 Blackhawk Blvd to serve alcohol. She said her son Matthew Cioni would be basically running the business since she has a fulltime position working at the hospital. The issue is that Mr. Cioni has a felony status because of DUI's, although he has completed drug and alcohol programs according to the city ordinance Section 6-11 Persons ineligible, no person who has been issued a retail liquor dealer's license shall employ any of the following persons on his premises: (1) any person who has been convicted of a felony or released from the conviction of a felony whichever is last, within the last ten years. A probation period was suggested, either way the ordinance would have to be changed. Ms. Dazey said she would not be able to operate the business without her son. Commissioner Redieske suggested running the business without selling liquor and maybe after a year come back in front of the city council and if there are no violations ask for a liquor license at that time. Ms. Dazey said she would think about it and get back to the city council regarding her decision. Commissioner Griffin made the motion to layover. Commissioner Clifton second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

Mayor Kirichkow congratulated Finance Director Mike Salmons for his excellent job working for the City of South Beloit. Mike said he would stay on part-time working for the City for as long as he was needed. Commissioner Griffin made the motion to accept Mike Salmons resignation. Commissioner Clifton second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

Commissioner Redieske made the motion to rehire Mike Salmons part-time at a rate of \$1,500 bi-weekly. Commissioner Stone second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

Commissioner Griffin made the motion to approve the Rood Avenue Engineering Contract. Commissioner Clifton second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

Sergeant Truman told the City Council that the Police Department has been having problems with the back door lock. He said the police department needs to have a good system because of not always being manned. Sergeant Truman said he would have to find out more details regarding the different types of locks and inform the City Council at the next meeting. Commissioner Griffin made the motion to layover. Commissioner Redieske second the motion and voice vote carried the motion.

Commissioner Griffin made the motion to approve the Street Department to plant grass seed at the city park with the standard IDOT seed mix. Commissioner Stone second the motion and roll call vote showed 5 ayes.
